 Attraction: this route is of geological, archaeological and wildlife importance and attracts many visitors annually.

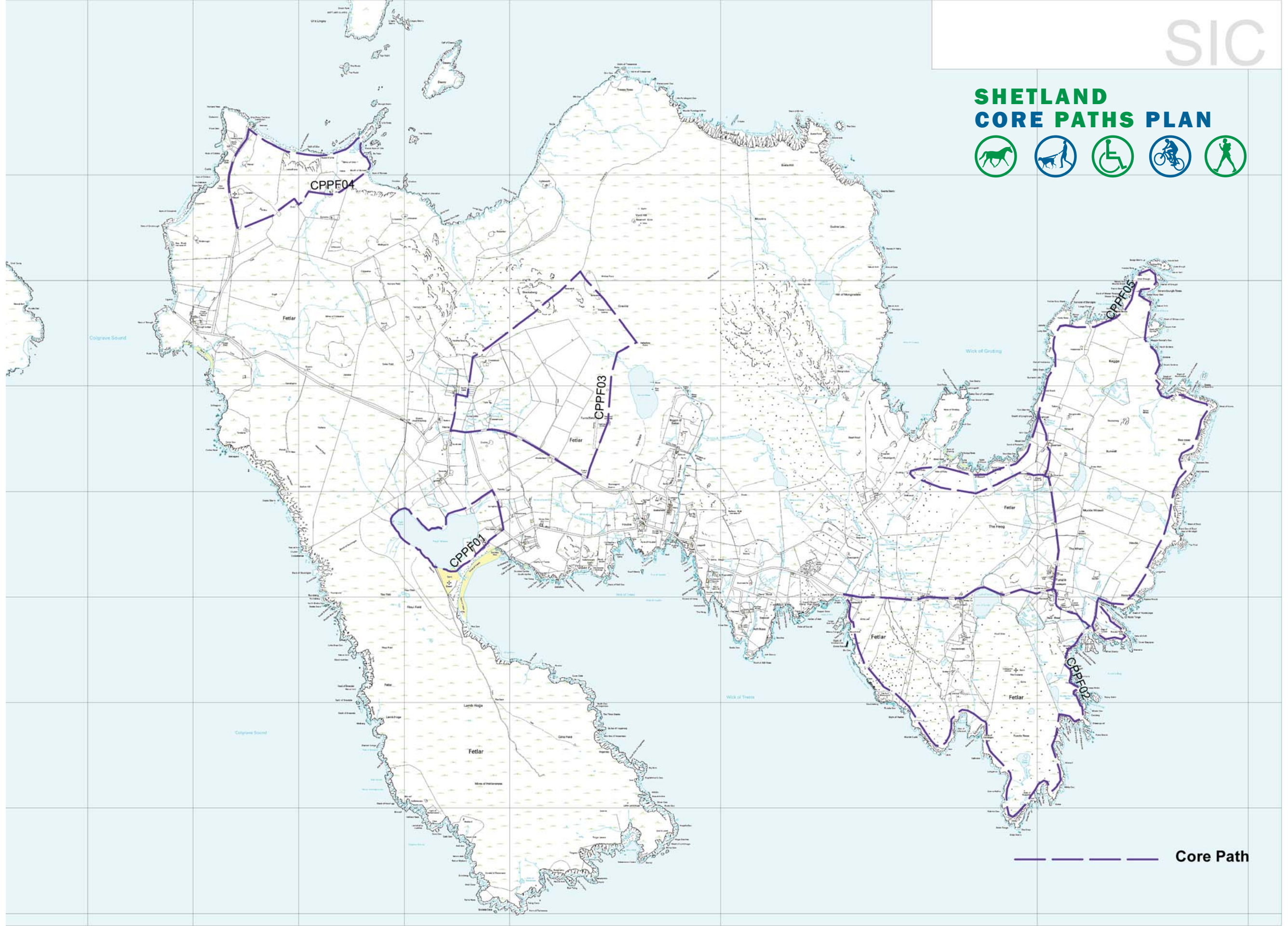
CPPF03:
 Haltlands – Finnigarth - Northdale
 Difficulty: challenging.
 Surface: heather and grass
 Attraction the route is attracts visitors interested in birds and archaeology.
 Designations: SSSI, SPA, SAC

CPPF04:
 Hammersness
 Difficulty: moderate to challenging
 Surface: grass and heather
 Attraction: this is popular tourist walk due to its crofting remains and scenery

CPPF05:
 Strandbrough
 Difficulty: challenging
 Surface: heather and grass
 Attraction: the route is popular with bird watchers.
 Designations: SSSI, SPA

Fetlar relies heavily on visitors to sustain the local economy. Fetlar is often referred to as "the garden of Shetland". This is due to its reputation for its variety of flora and fauna, and most especially its birds. The core paths within the island support the main visitor attractions and through their promotion will hopefully increase visitor numbers.
