 Attraction: scenery

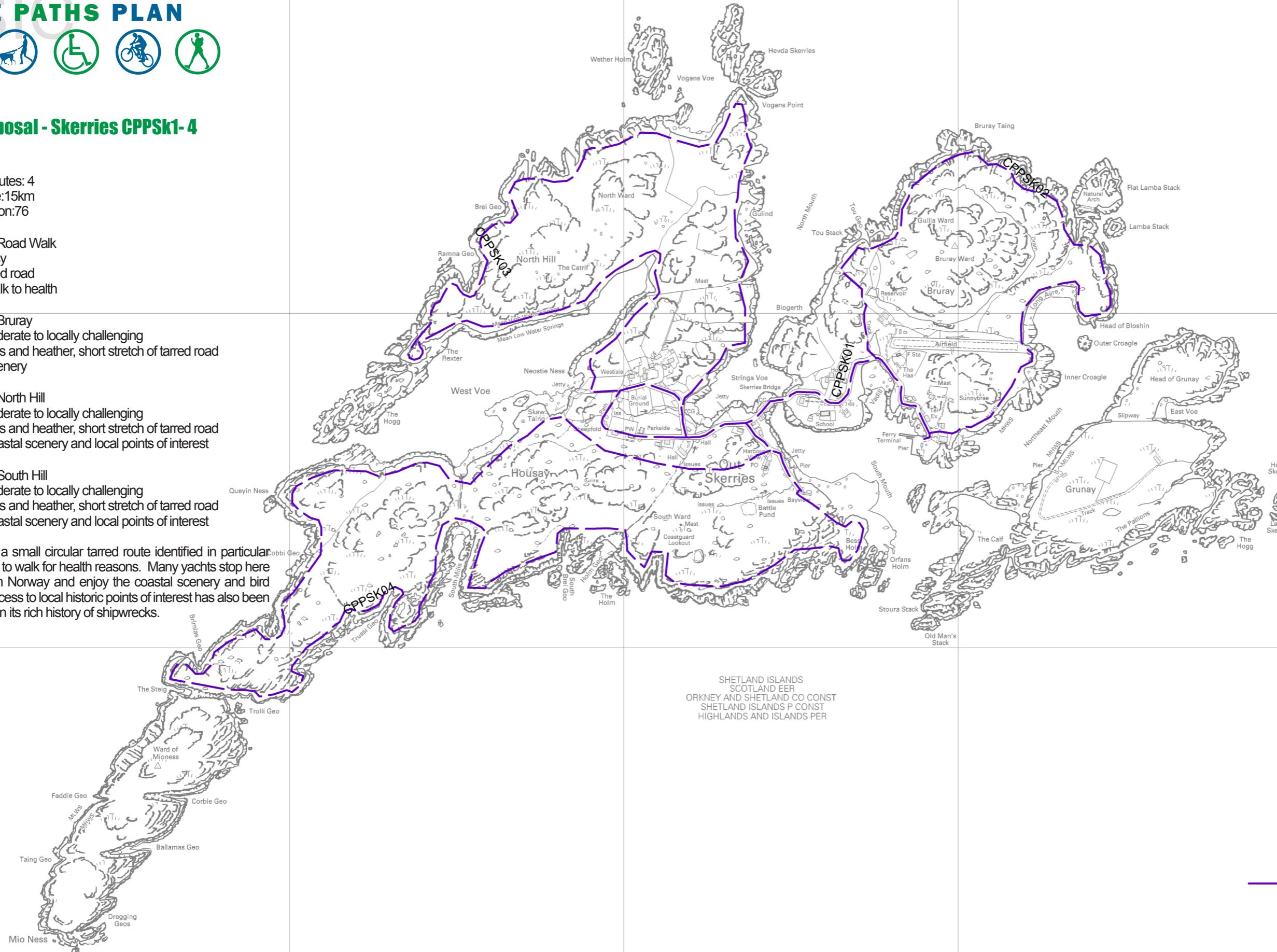
CPPSk03: North Hill

Difficulty: moderate to locally challenging
 Surface: grass and heather, short stretch of tarred road
 Attraction: coastal scenery and local points of interest

CPPSk04: South Hill

Difficulty: moderate to locally challenging
 Surface: grass and heather, short stretch of tarred road
 Attraction: coastal scenery and local points of interest

Skerries has a small circular tarred route identified in particular by the elderly to walk for health reasons. Many yachts stop here on route from Norway and enjoy the coastal scenery and bird watching. Access to local historic points of interest has also been provided given its rich history of shipwrecks.
