Appendix 9 Testing the Local Development Plan (LDP) Objectives against the SEA Objectives

The SEA assessment process involves testing of the LDP objectives against the SEA objectives. This is a preliminary 'assessment' of the LDP. It is used as an indicator of consistency and to highlight any areas where there is the potential for conflict. The 'test' does not include, or take into consideration, any policies that will be developed under the LDP objectives.

The criteria used to test the LDP Objectives against the SEA objectives comprise:
