C Anderson informed those present that the Polycrub for the community fridge was now in place. She would be getting in touch with electricians to get power in place for the fridge and freezer. C Anderson had met with Anita Jamieson from SIC Housing last week and had a discussion about the Old Urafirth School Project. Anita gave some contacts to get in touch with and said there was Scottish Government guidance for community led housing coming out in Spring 2024. C Anderson and A Jamieson agreed to organise a wider housing meeting with NCC and SIC councillors in the new year. C Anderson said that NCDC would be moving down to Bruckland for the new year. CCllr R Doull asked if the hall would have internet. C Anderson said that the committee were looking to put in internet anyway because they now had card machines for using on the bar. CCIIr R Doull said it was good to hear updates from NCDC and especially around the housing. She thought that other community councils were also having problems with the centralisation of housing. CCllr R Doull asked Cllr T Morton if there was an update on the clothing bin. Cllr T Morton said it was still there. He had spoken to SIC sanitisation, but nothing more had happened so far.

Viking Community Fund

C Anderson apologised for not getting the consultation results circulated before the meeting. Cllr R Doull said to keep on the agenda for the next meeting and asked Cllr J Parry if he had any updates. Cllr J Parry said that six priorities had been agreed by the people of Shetland and SCBF were now deciding the best way to move forward.

Cllr R Doull said the consultation was now finished and to remove from the agenda.

C Anderson said that she had never received a completed application form from CCIIr B Wilcock. CCIIr R Doull received a message from CCIIr B Wlicock saying she had never received the form.

Community Council Review

CCIIr J Parry attended the meeting in Brae and said it had been quite interesting. He added it highlighted that he would like Northmavine CC to keep the same boundary. He also thought that Delting were of the same mind. CIIr E MacDonald said she had attended a Delting CC meeting last week, and DCC were of the same opinion that boundaries should stay the same. DCC felt they were very different to Northmavine and Lunnasting. CCIIr R Doull spoke to CCIIr D Brown today and he was of the same view. She asked C Anderson to submit a response on behalf of the NCC. CCIIr J Parry asked if it was just a response from the Community Council or individual responses. CIIr E MacDonald said it each Community Council expected to put in a response. CCIIr R Doull suggested removing from the agenda but CIIr E

	MacDonald said it was a longer term process and that the NCC would probably be asked to consider different aspects of the
	consultation on a regular basis.

	Shetland Women's Aid
	C Anderson had attended the event on behalf of NCDC and NCC. She said it was a very informative event and that Shetland Women's Aid are keen to work with community groups. She said that Shetland Women's Aid were going into the high schools for and speaking about all the different forms of abuse with 1 st and 3 rd pupils and that they were hoping to go into primary schools too. They also have a Children and Young Person Referral Service for girls and boys and children over the age 12 can self- refer to the service. She also said that Women's Aid recognised that isolation can be a big problem and NCDC were hoping to work with them in the new year to offer space in the portacabin at Bruckland when it was needed. Women's Aid are aiming to do a marketing campaign next year to highlight all the services they offer. CCllr R Doull asked if they supported men who were subject to abuse. C Anderson said that Shetland Women's Aid did not
	support men but they had helpline numbers for charities that do. CCIIr R Doull said that NCC can be approached at any time. Action: Remove from agenda
	Roads CCIIr R Doull informed those present that a member of the public had been in contact with the Roads Department about the flooding at New Cottage, Eshaness. C Anderson was not sure whether SIC had been to look at the problem yet. CCIIr R Doull suggested sending an email to the roads department with the different issues that were spoken about at the last meeting and the issue in Eshaness.
6. SCBF	Action: Clerk to email Roads Department As has been previously mentioned, C Anderson had not circulated the
consultation	consultation results but CCIIr J Parry gave a short overview. There had been six points chosen by the people of Shetland for the funding pot – young people, transport, broadband, cost of living crisis, housing and environment. SCBF were now working with SSE on how the main fund would be administered and version five of the legal agreement was currently with the lawyers. The new agreement should be ready for August/ September 2024 and will probably be similar to the current
	AGS scheme.
7. AGS	There were three applications received for discussion.
Applications	Ollaberry Youth Club were looking for £500 to purchase craft supplies for bairns at the club.
	Northmavine Up Helly Aa committee were looking for £4315.20 to purchase new tools to upgrade what they have already and had submitted a quote with what they are looking for.
	The St Olaf Community Club were looking for £10000 to help with the refurbishment of the wind turbine at the Ollaberry Hall.
	CCIIr R Doull asked how much was left in the pot. C Anderson said there was £1601.34 left however the funding awarded to Ability Shetland in October would not have come off that total yet and it was £2470. After a discussion among the Community Councillors present, it was decided to award Ollaberry Youth Club 100%, NUHA 75% and
