#### 5.Matters Arising

#### **NCDC**

The clerk informed CCIIrs that NCDC has teamed up with the Scottish Island Federation to gather data on Marine Litter. The first beach clean had been conducted in April with 23.3kg of waste collected from the West Ayre, Hillswick. The data is fed into a national database.

# 6.Community Council Scheme Review

Mrs L Hall gave an overview of the proposed changes to the scheme which are now out for consultation phase 2. There are seven proposals. There was a discussion around the proposals by CCllrs. CCllr D Brown pointed out the proposal to reduce elected CCllr members from 9 to 8 seemed a shame when NCC had not had problems filling the seats in the past. Mrs L Hall

	suggested linking with the newly formed NCDC Youth Board in order to attract Youth membership to the NCC. Mrs L Hall added that NCC could respond to the consultation as a group and also as individuals.  CCIIr D Brown said that NCC would publicise the consultation was open to the public and would put together a response at the next meeting. The clerk added that she had received paper copies of the consultation which would be going out to the local shops in the next couple of days. CIIr E MacDonald stated that the consultation was open until the 28th June.  Action: Clerk to distribute consultation documents and publicise online option via social media.

CCllr D Brown added he had noticed the Eastness road in Ollaberry was in poor condition, especially around the cattle grid. Cllr E MacDonald said it had been the Island Forum. There had been a seminar on how the government could help with the building of housing in island communities but the discussion had been at a very strategic level, there was a lot of discussion with island communities having similar problems especially around the cost of materials and labour. CCllr D Brown said he had heard the last Hjaltland house that had come up for rent in Hillswick had attracted a lot of interest. CCllr R Doull said it was similar in
